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
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What is Competition Manipulation?





What is competition manipulation?



When athletes cheat by losing on purpose or by not doing their best in a competition

When officials or coaches deliberately make wrong decisions, affecting the competition or its outcome

This is competition manipulation!



First manipulation


Often small and a first step towards more serious offences

When the target wants to quit or does not cooperate

YOU are an ideal target for corruptors because...






YOU are on the field of play!

Possible Sanctions



Sports Sanction

Ban (up to life) and fine

You may get a life ban from your sport for manipulating a competition.

Criminal Sanction

Jail and fine

Competition manipulation is considered a criminal offence in a growing number of countries.

Loss of credibility

Loss of sponsors and fans.
Ruining of your personal credibility and reputation worldwide.



Code of Conduct: The 4 Key Rules

CODE OF CONDUCT





DON'T FIX your competition and always do your best.

DON'T BET on your own sport or the Olympic Games.

DON'T SHARE inside information. Non-public information about your sport stays private.

ALWAYS REPORT an approach to manipulate or anything suspicious:

RULE #2
DON'T BET

If you are a baseball player from Europe, can you bet on baseball competitions in the Americas?

No. Athletes & officials must not bet on their own sport, even if it is in a different region.

If you were competing in softball at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games, were you allowed to bet on the Tokyo 2020 volleyball events?

No. Accredited athletes and officials must not bet on any event of the Olympic Games.

If you are competing in baseball at the Asian Games, can you bet on the football events at the Asian Games?

No. Athletes & officials must not bet on any sport in a multi-sport competition that they themselves are competing in.





RULE #1




DON'T FIX the competition and always do your best.
