American Samoa Baseball 2020

Baseball and softball had a combined little league program with about 300 kids ranging from 3-18. The games were good with Nick King, Chris King and about 15 other coaches involved. We did both baseball and softball for the kids and softball for the high school girls. We also had the first annual Tony and Ben Solaita Softball Classic which had 14 teams come out and play.

Goals and objectives

The goal of this proposal is to obtain funding that will allow the Summer Little League Baseball/softball Programs to take place. This program will foster baseball and softball sports development which will help continue to build these athletic extracurricular programs in the schools. - 4. Prepare youth for national and international baseball competition.

FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA (FSM) 2020 Activities

Objectives & Major Achievements for the Year:

Meeting was held middle of this year to dialogue upon matters requested by WBSC on key issues/requirements from the FSM Baseball Softball Federation. Items in the agenda are: 1.) To select State representatives from Yap, Chuuk and Kosrae and Pohnpei as members of FSMBSF. 2.) To complete the vacancy in the FSMBSF Executive Board, 3.) To propose a draft Constitution Bylaws for FSMBSF and 4.) Future plans/ activities for 2021. Leading the discussion is the newly appointed Interim President- Mr. Loyola, Interim Secretary General- Mr. Scaliem along with FSM Olympic Committee SG James R. Tobin.

The matter was put on hold due to COVID 19 Pandemic, travel restriction within the FSM and low internet connection within the states for Zoo1n virtual meeting. Looking forward to continue the process and hopefully seek adoption for the new Constitution and filling of the vacancies in the federation at the beginning of 2021.

Main objectives for FSMBSF are to:

- Identify and train our baseball and softball athletes
- Provide training to certify our community and national coaches and officials
- Compete in both Regional, Oceania and International games
- Seek support and funding from the International Federation and stakeholders for our programs.

Attendance & Results at International / Regional Tournaments.

In January of 2020, Pohnpei National Team and Kosrae National Team have participated in the 3th Micronesia Baseball Classic (MBC) held at Paseo Stadium in Guam. USA. At these games, each of the 4 FSM States represented their own Island home. A total of 4 teams participated in the Micronesian Baseball Classic. Guam and CNMI have been to there for three consecutive tournaments. This mark the first ti1ne Team Pohnpei has attended the MBC. Unlike Pohnpei, Kosrae attended the MBC for the second time. As always Fiji and Japan competed for the Fiji JapanBaseball Cup which Japan held earlier this year. Fiji played well this time and won the Cup for the end of the year series.

We were surprised at the number of FSM and Nauru youths that resides in Fiji for education, they competed on the day which looked promising for the future. First timers Nauru played really well which we feel that they could get better with some practice and more game time. FSM had experienced players but most haven't played for a while and with more practice they could be competitive in the next competition. The Fiji team won the overall tournament and a great boost to the development of the gamesas now we have more teams to play against in future.

Official On-line Handover of donated Baseball / Softball equipment from Fukui, Japan.

The Fiji Islands Baseball & Softball Association (FIBSA) recently received donated Baseball/Softballequipment from Japan through our Fiji Baseball coach Takahiro Nishio prefecture. Coach Taka san hometown collected this equipment from people of Fukui.

Mr. Nishio became a baseball instructor of the JICA cooperation team in October 2018, and after workingin Sri Lanka, he was assigned to Fiji from in September, 2019. He mainly coached children and young people, and also served as a coach when convening the national team in the country. Fiji does not have a baseball shop and relies on support from Japan, the United States and Australia. However, there is a chronic shortage, and children often use wooden sticks and pebbles as bats and balls.

Mr. Nishio has solicited a wide range of baseball equipment from the citizens of the prefecture since November last year through a support group created by experienced cooperative teams in the prefecture. By September of this year, a total of about 600 items such as grabs, bats, balls, and uniformshad been sent. Approximately 150 of these items were sent to the site, and the costs were donated by

support groups and citizens of the prefecture. It can be used not only in the suburbs of the capital but also in rural areas including remote islands to promote baseball.

Mr. Nishio himself returned to Japan in March of this year due to a temporary evacuation due to the spread of the new coronavirus infection. He continued to coach the national team online and ended histerm in October. At the delivery ceremony in mid-November, executives of the Fiji Baseball Softball Association hoped that exchanges with Mr. Nishio and Fukui Prefecture would continue.

Mr. Nishio said in an interview, "I don't think that so many supplies will be gathered, and I am really grateful. It was a step toward popularization in Fiji. I want people who will bear the future of the regionthrough baseball to grow." It was.

The FIBSA would like to thank Fukui prefecture and coach Taka san for their kind donated which willcontribute towards the development of Baseball & Softball in Fiji.

Commercial

Commercially, we have again recorded strong results bringing on several new partners including Kumho Tyre, National Storage, PTP, Aussie Athlete Agency and Gamesense as well as retaining our partners from the previous 12 months.

We also entered a crucial partnership with Crocmedia who not only greatly improved the broadcast of our Australia Pacific Cup and Summer Slam – Fully Loaded Softball tournaments, but also provided live streaming of our Men's and Women's National Championships.

Importantly, Crocmedia provide us with multimedia facilities, including a full broadcast studio, to assist us in creating engaging content around major announcements. Another aspect of our partnership is the ability to tap into their extensive commercial contacts to sell our sport further.

La Trobe University partnership

The Softhall Australia and Softhall Victoria offices moved into the new La Trobe Sports Stadium based in Rundoora

we now have access to first class sports science facilities, training grounds and meeting rooms.

We have also entered a partnership with La Trobe University and their internship program allowing us to achieve more in various areas of the business while assisting in the professional development of students.

Grassroots

At a grassroots level we have re-invigorated the Softball Batter Up (SBU) program including the development of starter packs an online platform for purchasing equipment and offered every Association who runs an SBU program store credit. We also offered up a number of beginner coaching courses for free to arm Associations with the necessary knowledge to host their own junior participation programs.

I'm pleased that the organisation has invested in the marketing of the sport with investment in digital SEO/SEM and Google AdWords in a first for the sport.

COVID-19 effect on play

In March, Australia was in the grips of the global COVID-19 Pandemic, an uncertain time for not only the country, but the entire world. There is no playbook to follow for a situation such as this, but I am extremely proud of our staff and our Member States for their handling of the situation.

From Softball Australia's perspective, it was important to share relevant information we were receiving from the Australian Government and Sport Australia. Softball Australia does not have the ability to enforce a cancellation on local tournaments, but recommended competition be suspended following our first wave of COVID-19 infections, falling in line with other NSOs and sporting codes.

This information was not met with resistance from the community but rather understanding of the unique situation and of course disappointment. I would like to commend our State SEOs around the country for how they all professionally and efficiently handled this unprecedented situation.

Of course, we didn't escape the COVID-19 Pandemic without a hit, notably we were forced into the cancellation of the U23 Men's and Women's National Championships along with the International Friendship Series, Aussie Diamonds and Futures Tours originally planned for April 2020.

The re-scheduling of international events including the Open Men's and U18 Women's World Cups also led to a small re-shuffle of 2021 National Championship dates.

Our Open Women's squad was obviously dealt the harshest cards with the re-scheduling of the 2020 Olympic Games to 2021, however this news was taken in stride by the group who remain focused on a fifth Olympic Medal.

Guam makes history, qualifies for U-15 Baseball World Cup



20/01/2020

It's the first time Guam has qualified for a WBSC event. The closest it ever came previously was a loss to South Africa in a playoff for the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

Guam defeated New Zealand, 12-0, on home turf at *Paseo* Stadium in Hagåtña to win the final of the Oceania Region Qualifier and earn a historic spot in the **WBSC U-15 Baseball World Cup**.

Nolan Babauta, nicknamed *Princess*, dominated New Zealand from the mound. He allowed only two hits and helped himself with three RBIs on three hits, a couple of singles and a double.
