Relation with LOC (and eventual issues raised during the event, if any)	On Arrival on the 8th for the relocation of the fence they had already started and did not take on board previous discussion regarding the base of the fence. Wu, Trevor and I explain the way the fence base needed to go, and they began to make the adjustments.  Again, the venue preparation was a lot of work, and the fence moving group did not seemed to understand what was needed in terms of safety. On return to the venue when all was completed Wu, Trevor and I made many changes to the fence to minimise all unsafe areas.

Meals	Officials – Some meal provided by the LOC other supplied by the individuals. Meals were hit and miss, and the umpires expressed concern over this which I understand. We were having to find places late evening to try and get a meal which was difficult.	
Ceremonies	Opening Ceremony – I worked with the LOC on and explained to the teams where they would be standing and what the schedule was. They continued with Military Colours and salute for anthems but cut the fire dance display.	
Laundry	Officials – Laundry facilities were on site at The Hanger, hours of operation had to be negotiated with staff.	
Relation with the Participating Teams (and eventual issues raised during the event, if any)	Australia and American Samoa were great to work with and the team staff were very easy and understanding when issues would arise. Weather was a concern as we had 30+ degrees, 80% minimum humidity and extreme UV with no wind. We also used an ice bath to cool players and also have cold towels in for cooling purposes.  NZ Delegate in attendance (Lyn Lockhart) was a pleasure to deal with and I valued her support throughout the events. The New Zealand team manager was not the easiest person to work with and continually commented on them having to be	
	there and the amount of money spent for them to be there. We had many issues and discussions in the days prior and during the competition. The NZ coaches and additional staff were understanding of the conditions.  I feel at times the LOC felt uneasy with my continual requests

Relation with Other Parties (and eventual issues raised during the event, if any)	The ground crew lead was very good and read the ground and weather. I would ask him daily how the weather looked and how the ground came up overnight and he was very informative with a sense of humor.

General Evaluation of the International Officials	Wu was great to work with, very supportive and helpful in decisions made. Due to the complexities of the event daily I made sure to use Wu or always keep him in the loop.	

	Trevor and Wu went above and beyond with helping with fixing the field for safety.  Kirsty took on a big role and went above and beyond, coordinating with the LOC admin and daily schedule reviews.  Rex was great to have around the event and a good support when need to push works necessary.	
Comments about Local Officials (if any)	The LOC personnel we were dealing daily with were all very lovely people.	
General Evaluation of the Local Officials (if any – please list any of the local officials eventually eligible to be part of the International Officials)	I had to monitor the use of the grounds and training field due to the conditions and one team pushing the barrier continuously on this. I enforced the 1.5hr field familiarisation use but had to call that due to the weather and ground conditions after heavy rain. My view remained the same to all teams and LOC - the field needs to be safe and ready so all games can be played, and I again stressed to the LOC and teams that all things event were to be equal for all teams.	
Technical Matters (and eventual issues raised during the event, if any)	We completed all 9 games and due to weather, all games were played under a Heat Rule – 5 minute rehydration break at the end of the 3 <sup>rd</sup> and again at the end of the 5 <sup>th</sup> .  No score board – as the TV option at the front of the stands did not work.  Awards given by the LOC – Stats had to be assessed for MVP and best Defensive Player.  Continued the use of walkie talkies to relay changes to the statistician as the initial messaging was not quick or clear.	
Playing Field(s) and Ground Crew (what worked well and/or challenges)	The playing surface was an issue but held up after the heavy rain and the daily heavy use by the men's games. Getting the LOC to role, water and drag continuously was again asked many many times. After asking a few times, removing the tarps after the rain had to be started by the WBSC Officials for the LOC to act on this and assist. Removing these and allowing the sun and heat on the ground was good for drying out the mud areas.  There were times I had to rush field maintenance off the field for game start or start the plate meeting whilst they were still making.

Medical issues, Anti- Doping issues, Injuries (list if any specific case, issues, problems, actions)	Issue not reported but known to me – NZ catcher suffered cramps in a game and at the conclusion of the game and the warm down, in the sun, he began to cramp all over and was not in good shape. The Australian team physio was on hand to assist and cooled the catcher's body in the ice bath we had provided, and an ambulance was called. I checked in with the Physio and team manager regarding the situation and the player at the time and later in the afternoon. The player was in the hospital until early evening being hydrated.
